| <input type="checkbox"/> | <p>Valid passport – original</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signed by the holder • with at least two consecutive blank pages • valid for at least 90 days beyond the return date of the trip to the Schengen Area • issued within the last 10 years |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 1 copy of the passport , including all pages with entries/visas |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 1 biometric passport photo (35x45mm) , not older than six months with a bright background and frontal view of the face. Digitally altered passport pictures will not be accepted. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | <p>Travel itinerary: flight reservations (intended or booked flights) or train/ ferry tickets (you need to gather detailed information about your journey, such as whether you need to change terminals at the airport and consequently go through entry procedures)</p> |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | <p>A visa/residence permit for the country you are traveling to (if applicable) and a photocopy of the passport page containing that permit, or another document proving your right to enter the country</p> |

You may need an airport transit visa if

1. You are a citizen of a country that does not benefit from the “transit privilege”

AND

2. You do not have a valid visa or residence permit from a member state of the Schengen area or the EU/EEA
 - Please note: **if you have a valid Irish Residence Permit or a valid Irish re-entry visa (or a valid visa from another Schengen country), you do not need an airport transit visa.**
 - an exception may also apply if you have a valid visa or residence permit from the US, Canada, Japan or a valid UK Biometric Residence Permit – see a full list of exceptions on the website listed below.

AND

3. You are travelling via an international airport in Germany to a country outside the Schengen area
 - An airport transit visa allows for a short stopover at an international airport only, without leaving the airport’s international transit area or an overnight stay in a hotel. Not all airports in Germany have an international transit area, please check the list on the website mentioned below.
 - If you need to leave the international transit area (e.g. to catch a connecting flight at a different terminal or at another airport within the Schengen area), please apply for a regular Schengen visa.
